

PhD scholarships offered at Macquarie University for Climate Change adaptation for Terrestrial Biodiversity.

Macquarie University in conjunction with National Climate Change Adaptation Facility – Terrestrial Biodiversity Network will be offering three PhD scholarships to the value of \$20, 427 p.a. for 3.5 years tax exempt for fulltime research or \$10, 957 taxable for part-time study. These scholarships are for research focused on climate change adaptation for terrestrial biodiversity and based at Macquarie University in Sydney. The scholarships are available for research undertaken from July 2009.

Eligibility

- The scholarships are available to Australian residents or citizens in any discipline.
- Research must be relevant to areas investigating climate change adaptation for terrestrial biodiversity.
- Applicants must have Bachelor's degree with first-class honours, or be regarded by Macquarie University as having demonstrated an equivalent level of academic attainment in prior studies, relevant work or research experience. Master's degree from a recognized Australian university.
